SCI Foundation established the American Wilderness Leadership School (AWLS) in 1976 with the vision of providing educators with a useful hands-on experience they can use in the classroom. The school has provided a credited wildlife management program to 5,175 teachers since 1976. Through these teachers, the program reaches out to more than a million students annually. Also, AWLS currently provides fun and challenging experiences for 1,296 students annually in the student program.
